According to Wisconsin Statues 174.05 every dog over the age of 5 months is required to be licensed. Proof of rabies vaccination is required to be given to the town treasurer before a license can be issued. Please enclose a self- addressed stamped envelope for the return of license and rabies certificate.

Spayed/ Neutered: \$3.00/per dog Not Spayed/Neutered: \$8.00/ per dog

Just please be advised there is no shooting allowed any longer down there. We had a tornado come through in July of this year and even though it caused some damage, no one was hurt and no houses were lost, so we are all very thankful for that, and thankful to everyone in our community who came together to help afterwards. The Town has the new generator and air conditioning for the Hall, as well as a new facelift on the front of the building with new siding that replaced the old wood siding that was beginning to rot.
